With reference to your letter dated September 22nd, 1980, in connection with the subject mentioned above, I am to inform you that the Honorable Chief Justice, Sir Isaac Hyatali, has given the following ruling thereon and has directed as follows: -

Subject to the production in Court for its perusal of the original certificates of admission on the day on which a petition for admission is on the list to be heard, there is no objection to the acceptance of petitions for admission which is supported by a letter from the Deputy Director certifying that the petitioner is entitled to and will be awarded a Legal Education Certificate at the Graduation Ceremony on whatever date it is fixed to be held. However under no circumstances whatsoever should a petition be heard or a petitioner admitted without production to the Court of the original Legal Education Certificate and a true photocopy thereof for filing in the records of Court.
